Physical Education: 4 credits, not included in the credits for graduation. For extra 2 PE credits can be counted as other departments credits. Outstanding athletes shall follow the rules of the Office of Physical Education and Sport. 2. Service Learning I and II: 2 semesters in total, 0 credit (Service Learning III not included). 3. English Proficiency Requirement: 0 credit. Students who don't pass any English proficiency test cannot graduate from the school. 4. General Education : 28 credits i. Core Competencies: at least 3 credits. The following is the course rule of "Information Literacy" course: Requirement: 1 credit (International students don't need to take this course.) ii. Language Competencies: 10 credits ➤ College Chinese: 4 credits ➤ Foreign Language: 6 credits, 4 credits of "Freshman English" + 2 credits of "English for Academic Communication: Listening and Speaking" iii. Domain Competencies: at least 10 credits ➤ Humanistic Domain, Social Science Domain, and Natural Domain: at least one course in each Domain, total at least 6 credits. ➤ Integrated Domain: at least 4 credits. ➤ For National Defense education courses, only credits of 1 course can be counted as general education graduation credits. Overload credits cannot be recognized as the credits from another college /department. ➤ Our program belongs to the area of business and management, therefore, only one course from this area will be recognized. iv.
