III. Transfer credits: maximum 12 credits		According to NCHU regulation for credit exemption, students apply for credit exemption and complete the process within two weeks after the registration date of the admission semester.	
IV. Undergraduate credits from discipline-related courses may be counted as graduation credits.		According to NCHU regulation, students who need to take undergraduate courses for research purposes can submit the application during the period of course selection, and obtain approval from the chairperson, advisor, chairperson of the course offered, and dean of the academic affairs. The credits may be counted as graduation credits after students pass the courses. The maximum for such undergraduate credits: 6 credits

VII. Prerequisite Courses (not included in graduation credits): <u>0</u> credits

According to NCHU graduate regulation, students should take certain perquisite courses at the undergraduate level, which would be decided by advisors and chairperson. Prerequisite credits will not be counted as graduation credits. Students are not allowed to attend the thesis defense if they haven't completed the prerequisite courses.

VIII. Thesis Defense:

- 1. Students should discuss with their advisors prior to the end of first academic year.
- 2. Students must get the certification of "Education on Academic and Research Ethics" course before the application of the oral defense.
- 3. Students who complete minimum of enrollment, fulfill graduation credits, and complete the draft of thesis should apply for oral defense at least 20 days prior to the oral defense. The passing grade for defense is 70.

Oral defense comprises 50% of graduation grade Students must learn "Education on Academic and Research Ethics" course and have the exam for getting the certificate from the website of the Research Ethics Education. Master thesis should be written in English and oral defense should be carried out in English. Students who fail oral defense within enrollment should retake it again next semester or year. If students

who retake oral defense fail again, their study will be terminated.

The grade for retaking oral defense is 70.

IX. Others:

- Students who meet one of the following criteria and provide relevant documentation to the chairperson for recognition are considered to have passed the language proficiency requirement for graduation:
 - 1) A TOEFL ITP score of 523 and above
 - 2) A TOEFL CBT score of 193 and bove
 - 3) A TOEFL iBT score of 69 and above
 - 4) An IELTS score of 5.5 and above
 - 5) A PET or higher levels of the Cambridge ESOL examinations
 - 6) A TOEIC score of 670 and above
 - 7) Passing the GEPT high-intermediate level listening & reading comprehension test or above
 - 8) Other language certificates recognized by the Ministry of Education with levels equivalent to GEPT high-intermediate or above
 - 9) Students who had studied in an English-speaking country for two years (or more) within three years prior to enrollment.
- 2. Students must choose one from corporate internship (excluding students applying for the part-time program, students from Mainland China, international students, overseas Chinese students, and students from Hong Kong and Macau), outbound exchange, international volunteers, business competition, or overseas visiting. "Guideline for Off-campus Internship" and "Guideline for outbound exchange, international volunteers, business competition or overseas visiting for Master Program" are stipulated separately.
- 3. Students who choose to fulfill graduation requirements through corporate internship, the "Enterprise Internship" course offered by the College of Management's master's program can't be counted in graduation credits.

According to Article 2 of the "Regulations for the Assessment of English Proficiency Graduation Standards for Students at National Chung Hsing University," departments are authorized to establish their own English proficiency graduation standards for graduate students.
